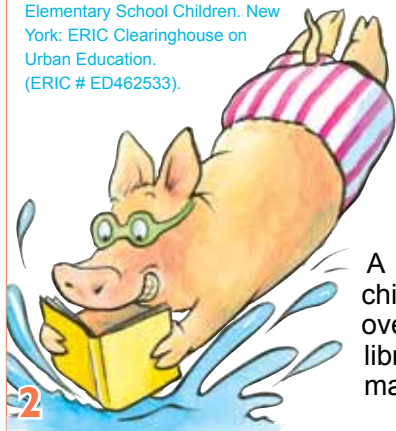

Summer reading makes a difference! According to government studies,* "many students lose one to two months' worth of reading performance during the summer." While that may not seem like much, several summers of reading losses can have "a large impact on children's performance."

A *Chicago Tribune* article reports that children who engage in educational activities over the summer, such as participating in a library's summer reading program, actually make slight **gains** in reading skill.

The Elmhurst Public Library is committed to helping parents motivate their children to read for pleasure and success over the summer. Our creative summer reading program offers entertaining books, prizes, stickers, programs, and raffles. Help your child build reading muscles – register for the summer reading program and visit the library often.

Remember, children read more when they see other people reading. **Be a role model—participate in EPL's Adult Summer Reading (see page 7).** Summer reading is good for everyone!

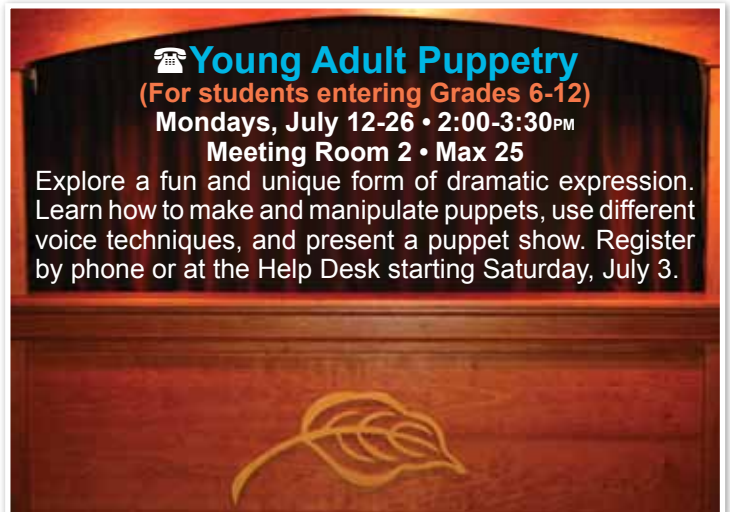

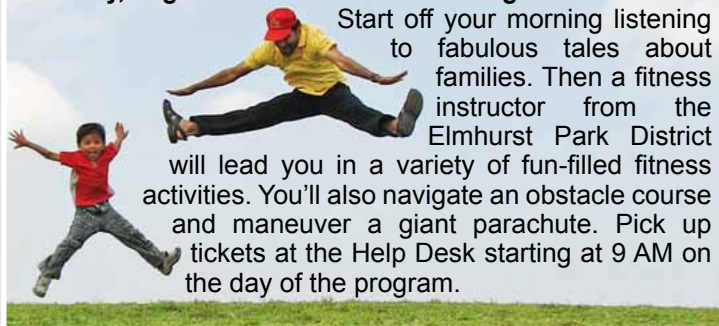

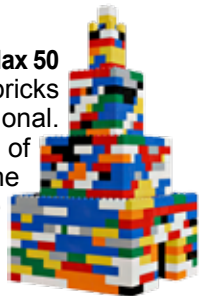
